4.	4.1.	CSAMH Addiction & Mental Health Barry Andres	 Mental Health Capacity Building in Schools: expansion following receipt of additional funding. Injectable Opioid Agonist Therapy: supervised injectable hydromorphone as second-line treatment for patients with severe opioid use disorder (OUD). Clinic launched in Calgary in late October; clinic in Edmonton slated to open February 2019. Developmental Pathways Training: 11 Trauma Informed Care training modules for healthcare providers better support children, youth and families experiencing addiction and mental health issues. Bill 30 – Mental Health Services Protection Act: creates licensing requirements for people providing addiction treatment and counselling services; establishes College of Counselling Therapy of Alberta to guide professional practice standards. Timeline for establishment of College expected to be 18 to 24 months; facility licensing will start summer 2019 and completed winter 2019. Regulations have to be developed and will be audited by an augment to Continuing Care auditors. Harm Reduction Policy for Psychoactive Substance Use: applies to services across the continuum; recognition abstinence is a goal but not required to access services – inclusive of contracted providers. Broad stakeholder engagement led to broader and more fulsome Policy than initially anticipated.
