- Dr. Tony Fields presented to the Council of Chairs in June the key achievements and future opportunities for the Cancer PAC. He also emphasized the importance of interaction between the Advisory Councils and Wisdom Council.
- Council joined in a discussion regarding the AHS Review recommendations and next steps with CancerControl Alberta leadership.
- Several members participated in stakeholder engagement sessions hosted by the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer on the 2019-2029 Canadian Strategy for Cancer Control. Feedback will be used to inform implementation of the strategy.
- Three members participated in the launch of the CancerControl Alberta Indigenous Strategy which brought together AHS, First Nations and Métis leaders with community members for a day of relationship building and development of themes for moving forward.
- Council provided feedback on the CancerControl Alberta 2019-20 Operational Plan.
- Consultation and feedback was provided into the revised Dental Program for Cancer Patients Policy.
- A member attended The Canadian Cancer Research Conference (CCRC) which brings together the Canadian cancer research community, to learn more on the latest developments and to enhance patient involvement in cancer research.
- Guidance, support, and personal knowledge from a cancer perspective were provided into the Calgary Zone Indigenous Health Action Plan by a PAC member.

A look ahead

We reviewed the **2019 Annual Survey** results for the Cancer PAC and have established some concepts to increase our participation in completing the survey.

Recruitment will be taking place to fill three vacancies in the coming year, including the appointment of a new Chair and Vice Chair for the Cancer PAC.

Continue to **learn** about and **enhance relationships** with other Advisory Councils and Wisdom Council by promoting the Cancer PAC, inviting members to our meetings and engaging and networking at the Spring Forum.

We will work to **encourage public attendance** at our Cancer PAC meetings by reaching out to people within our communities and increasing social media visibility.

Undertake a review of the Cancer PAC structure and look for efficiencies and maximize the opportunity for the Council.

The work of the Cancer Provincial Advisory Council has never been more important than now, in these challenging times. Members of the Council unfailingly provide perspectives that truly reflect the patient and family experiences of Albertans facing cancer.
