	Strong relationships with Zone Operations colleagues; ability of their	
	teams and ours to come together to work through issues and	
	concerns to 'do right' by our residents and clients remains strong.	
	Thanks to Council members for their actions and engagement in	
	activities to support this work. When initiatives have been identified to	
	improve services delivery, they have been implemented into practice. Staffing remains a challenge not just in continuing care but across	
	the system and remains a factor for what initiatives and	
	enhancements can be put in-place. Working to promote bursary	
	programs to increase HCAs within continuing care. Many actions/	
	activities have come out of COVID and incorporated into daily	
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	practice that have enhanced relationships and communication. Focus	
	on good and important work to be done. There may be changes in	
	direction recognizing desire to move forward and improve services	
	provision and accessibility. Many elements still at play that will inform	
	our strategy and help move continuing care forward.
