Reporting Clinical Adverse Events Using RLS

In order to identify patent safety problems and make improvements, it is important to report hazards, close calls and clinical adverse events (CAEs).

AHS has a single, province-wide system for patient safety reporting called the <u>Reporting & Learning System for Patient Safety</u> (RLS). Anyone with AHS login credentials can access the RLS to report patient safety events.

All physicians have a responsibility to report patient safety events. When you report a CAE, close call, or hazard though RLS, the submission is reviewed, trended and shared to help us learn as an organization. Reporting helps to identify patient safety problems and to make improvements.

We encourage you to consistently submit CAEs and other patient safety problems using <u>RLS</u>, available on Insite.

Update to the AHS/COV Hazardous Medication List

The Alberta Health Services (AHS)/Covenant Health (COV) <u>Hazardous</u> <u>Medication List</u> is updated and posted on the <u>Hazardous Medication Handling</u> <u>page</u> on Insite.

The changes to the List include:

- Addition of **14** new medications to the list, indicated by bold **BLUE** type
 - **3** classified as **KNOWN** hazard (mecasermin, tagraxofusp, talazoparib)
 - 2 classified as **POTENTIAL** hazard (enasidenib, pemigatinib)
- 9 classified as **REPRODUCTIVE** hazard (asciminib, avapritinib, capmatinib, selinexor, selpercatinib, selumetinib, siponimod, sodium phenylbutyrate-ursodoxicoltaurine, trastuzumab [plain])
- Change in Classification (from **POTENTIAL to KNOWN**) for **5** medications (chloramphenicol, cidofovir, diethylstilbestrol, lenalidomide, thalidomide)
- Removal of **1** medication from the list ruxolitinib

Implementing these changes:

- The new AHS/COV Hazardous Medication List is effective now.
- Teams and program areas are expected to identify and address the steps required to implement the changes (e.g., storage, labelling, etc.) **prior to May 1, 2023**.

Please note:

- Pharmacy Information systems (including Meditech, BDM, and Sunrise Clinical Manager) have been notified and will implement these changes.
- Requests for medication record (ERX) changes within Connect Care, and Compounding and Repackaging (CNR) have been submitted.
- Changes within Connect Care may be delayed due to build capacity.
- All information systems will not be updated at the same time.
- Due to the potential lag time in updating the information systems, follow the PPE precautions as identified in the AHS/COV *Hazardous Medication List*, as the list is the source of truth.
