New tip sheet for documentation of disclosure in Connect Care

AHS has standardized documenting disclosure of harm through an electronic process within Connect Care. A Smart Phrase can now be used to document immediate and ongoing disclosure of harm conversations. To learn more, review the newly created tip sheet <u>here</u>.

Immediate disclosure conversations should be done with patients and/or families within 24 hours after a clinical adverse event, following AHS' <u>Disclosure</u> of <u>Harm Procedure</u>, and documented in the patient care record.

AHS Pharmacy project presented at 2023 CADTH Symposium

Ondansetron Oral Disintegrating Tablet (ODT) Appropriateness and Stewardship Initiative, a clinical appropriateness project led by Pharmacy, supported by <u>Improving Health Outcomes Together (IHOT)</u>, presented as a <u>poster</u> at the <u>CADTH 2023 Symposium</u> in Ottawa. The project improves formulary adherence with education and implementation of system-wide changes, leveraging technology and collaboration. The <u>poster</u> highlighted engagement with 13 stakeholder groups and revision of 93 Connect Care order sets. Interim results show decreased relative use of ondansetron ODT. <u>Learn more about other</u> <u>Pharmacy Drug Utilization and Stewardship work</u>.
