Where do I park?



Parking Lots

- Surface lots are located: outside the 6th Avenue East Entrance and off of 5th Street.
- Take a ticket and keep it with you. Pay at the pay stations located in the parking lot or inside hospital entrances on level 1 and 2. Credit cards or coins are accepted.
- You will need to remember your license plate to pay for parking. Machine takes credit cards or coins. No change is provided - use exact change. If you need coins, 2 change machines are available (Atrium and Level 1, East lobby).
- Staying longer than expected? Before your time expires, add time to your permit at one of the pay stations.

Drop Off and Pick Up

There is a drop off and pickup area for MEYCC, at the Ambulatory Care entrance (on the east side).

Parking Passes

Long-term passes available at the parking office. Ask your nurse.

What do I need to bring with me?

Find a checklist of items to bring in the orange section of the Newly Diagnosed with Cancer book.



Checking in for your first appointment



Check in at the main reception desk at the MEYCC entrance.

From Ambulatory parking lot, take the elevator up to **level 2**. Please have your Photo ID and Albert Health Care card ready to show the clerk at each appointment.

When you check in, we will give you a copy of the **Newly Diagnosed with Cancer** book, if you don't already have one.

Places to stay



If you live outside of the Medicine Hat area and need a place to stay for appointments or treatments, ask a member of your cancer care team for a list of nearby accommodations.

Can I bring electronics?



Yes, you may bring your cell phone, laptop, tablet or other devices. Please be respectful and:

- Put your phone on vibrate
- Bring earphones for entertainment devices
- Network: Healthspot (no password required)
- iPads with electronic resources (e-library) are available for use
- In the treatment area you will have your own tv



It's a good idea to bring something to read or do while you wait for your appointments.

We have an art therapy cart for patients that may have longer appointments with us.

Where can I get my prescriptions filled?



Our cancer centre pharmacy provides your cancer treatment medicine. Prescriptions for support medications should be filled at your regular, retail pharmacy.
