

Provincial Education Online Opportunities!
Learning Essential Approaches to Palliative Care (LEAP)







The Palliative and End-of-Life Care (PEOLC) portfolios and the Provincial PEOLC team within AHS are excited to partner with Pallium Canada to deliver LEAP training to health care providers across the province until March 31, 2024.

The following will benefit from this LEAP PEOLC education at no cost to the learners:

- AHS Continuing Care Programs: Home Care, Palliative Home Care, Pediatric Home Care and Programs, Supportive Living
- AHS Continuing Care Contracted Providers: Covenant Health, Hospices, Contracted Agencies (Home Care), Supportive and Facility Living
- AHS Partners in Palliative Care: EMS, Community and Front-line Paramedics, Allied Health (Pharmacists, Social Workers, Physiotherapists, Spiritual Care), Acute Care & Emergency Staff and Physicians, Outpatient specialty clinics, Indigenous Programs and Partners, Community programs serving marginalized and homeless populations, Primary Care Networks (PCNs), etc.
- AHS and Continuing Care Contract Provider Health Care Aids and / or Personal Support Workers

Pallium's award-winning LEAP courses are considered the gold standard for PEOLC education for health care organizations and professionals in Canada. LEAP courses provide health care professionals with the knowledge, attitudes, and skills to help provide palliative care to patients and families facing life-limiting illnesses.

Funded by an Alberta Health Grant the following Pallium's courses are being offered provincially at no cost to learners:

- 1. **LEAP Core (Online)** is an interprofessional course that provides health care professionals (e.g., physicians, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, etc.) with an in-depth learning experience on essential skills and competencies of the palliative care approach.
- 2. **LEAP Paramedic** is a facilitated online learning course for paramedics and Emergency Medical Service professionals that teaches the essential practical knowledge, attitudes, and skills to provide a palliative care approach on-site.
- LEAP Personal Support Worker is an online, self-learning course that provides personal support workers, care aides, and health care assistants working in long term care, home care, nursing homes and acute care with the essential competencies to provide a palliative care approach. - Later in 2023, more LEAP courses will be developed and available (including but not limited to: Pediatrics, Indigenous Cultural Safety and Oncology).



Principles of Managing the Psychological Aspect of Pain

- Approach and treat the underlying psychological concern- Is the patient experiencing anxiety, depression, or other psychological issues? Do they have a history of trauma?
- Provide education unresolved psychological stressors are known to worsen the pain experience. Support patients with a trauma informed lens.
- What does the pain mean to the patient? Does this signify disease advancement?

Ask: What is the pain keeping you from doing?
What worries you about your pain?


