

ORDER OF AN EXECUTIVE OFFICER CLOSED FOR TENANT ACCOMMODATION PURPOSES ORDER TO VACATE

To: Melanie Johannesen

And To: All Occupant(s) of the following Housing premises:

RE: The housing premises located in Edmonton, Alberta and municipally described as:

12733 117 Street NW

WHEREAS I, an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services, have inspected the above noted premises pursuant to the provisions of the Public Health Act, RSA 2000, c. P-37, as amended;

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following conditions exist in and about the above noted premises which are or may become injurious or dangerous to the public health or which might hinder in any manner the prevention or suppression of disease, namely:

- a. The sewer line in the premises was in disrepair: There was an open excavation in the backyard for sewer line repairs, the area was enclosed with plastic mesh fencing barrier.
- b. There was no water supply to the premises, and the wastewater drainage was not functional. The occupant using alternatives such as bottle water for water supply, and baskets/plastic bags catching wastewater.
- c. Kitchen sink was not operational due to damaged sewage line.
- d. Bathroom fixtures were not operational due to damaged sewage line.
- e. There were no spindles installed on the guardrails on the front and back entrance stairs/landing area.
- f. The back guardrail was loose, the north end was not attached to the building.

AND WHEREAS such inspection disclosed that the following breaches of the Public Health Act and the Housing Regulation, Alberta Regulation 173/99, and the Minimum Housing and Health Standards exist in and about the above noted premises, namely:

- a. Items (a, b, c and d) are in contravention of section IV (6) (a and c) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards which states that: Every housing premises shall be connected to the public sewage system, or to an approved private sewage disposal system. (a) The plumbing system and the sanitary drainage system or private sewage disposal system, as the case may be, including drains, fixtures, traps, vents, stacks, waste disposal facilities, pump out sewage holding tanks, septic tanks and the disposal system shall be maintained in a proper operating condition. (c) All plumbing fixtures shall be serviceable, free from leaks, trapped and vented to the outside.
- b. Item (b) is also in contravention of section IV (9) (a) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards that states: Every building used in whole or in part, as housing premises must be supplied with a potable water supply of sufficient volume, pressure and temperature to

- serve the needs of the inhabitants. (a) All hot running water shall be maintained at a temperature of not less than 46 degrees C (114°F), and not more than 60 degrees C (140°F) measured at the plumbing fixture.
- c. Item (c) is also in contravention of section IV(14) (a) (i) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards that states: Every housing premises shall be provided with a food preparation area, which includes a kitchen sink that is supplied with potable hot and cold water and suitably sized to allow preparation of food, washing utensils and any other cleaning operation.
- d. Item (d) is also in contravention of section IV (7) (a) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards that states: **Except where exempt by regulation**, every housing premises shall be provided with plumbing fixtures of an approved type consisting of at least a flush toilet, a wash basin, and a bathtub or shower. (a) The washbasins and bathtub or shower shall be supplied with potable hot and cold running water.
- e. Items (e and f) are in contravention of section III (3) (c) (i) of the Minimum Housing and Health Standards that states: Inside or outside stairs or porches including all treads, risers, supporting structural members, hand rails, guards and balconies, shall be maintained in good repair and shall comply with the requirements of the Alberta Building Code or a Professional Engineer design.

AND WHEREAS, by virtue of the foregoing, the above noted premises are hereby declared to be **Closed for Tenant Accommodation Purposes**.

NOW THEREFORE, I hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT**:

- 1. That the occupants vacate the above noted premises on or before June 5, 2023.
- 2. That the Owner immediately undertake and diligently pursue the completion of the following work in and about the above noted premises, namely:
 - a. Repair the sewer line and drainage system to ensure it is in good operational condition.
 - b. Provide portable water supply of sufficient volume, pressure and temperature to serve the needs of the inhabitants.
 - c. Repair the damaged kitchen sink and ensure that all plumbing fixtures are in serviceable, free from leaks, trapped and vented to the outside.
 - d. Repair the damaged bathroom facilities and ensure that all plumbing fixtures are in serviceable, free from leaks, trapped and vented to the outside.
 - e. Repair the guardrails and ensure it is maintained in good repair and comply with the requirements of the Alberta Building Code or a Professional Engineer design.
- 3. That until such time as the work referred to above is completed to the satisfaction of an Executive Officer of Alberta Health Services; the above noted premises shall remain closed for tenant accommodation purposes.

The above conditions were noted at the time of inspection and may not necessarily reflect all deficiencies. You are advised that further work may be required to ensure full compliance with the Public Health Act and regulations, or to prevent a public health nuisance.
